


Centennial is a specialized 2-bed, licensed, Residential Treatment Home serving individuals with serious and persistent mental illness and exceptional behavioral health needs.

is a smaller-scale specialized treatment program-serving individuals who have a primary diagnosis of a major mental illness, and whose symptoms require specialized programming in order to help them succeed in the community and keep them out of higher levels of care.

Centennial is a one-story unlocked (class 3) co-ed program licensed by AMH. This program is located in the suburbs of Portland while being close in proximity to shopping, services, and the public transit line.

Centennial offers a full kitchen, spacious living room and family room, which provide the space and opportunity for residents to spend time and a beautiful deck with outdoor seating. Raised garden and flowerbeds offer beauty, as well the opportunity for therapeutic outdoor activities.

Residents enjoy the privacy of their own bedroom and have access to a shared bathroom.

The program is staffed 24 hours per day, 7 days a week by a caring and professional team (on a 2-2-2 schedule) who provide professional mental health treatment, support, and supervision in a comfortable home-like atmosphere.

Services meet the residential and behavioral health needs of the selected individuals, including but not

limited to:

- Psychiatric treatment,
- Individual and group therapy,
- Medication management,
- Skills training,
- Peer support, and
- Supported employment.

Examples of specialized programming have included AMH waivers for extra security measures based on demonstrated client need, increased staffing schedules for more intensive client supervision, client-specific behavioral support plans and staff training, physical modifications to client living spaces.



Who is Served? Centennial welcomes referrals for individuals who are stepping down from the State Hospital or other residential placement who are deemed clinically appropriate for community treatment at this level of care, who have a behavioral health symptoms that might otherwise provide barriers to care, or needs that require exceptional treatment, supervision, and supports.
