

Jackson Park (est. 2014) is a unique Supportive Housing program that serves tenants who have chronic mental illness. For many individuals, stepping down into this level of care is a wonderful achievement and evidence of their hard work and commitment of recovery.

This program provides four 2-bedroom units of housing. The program also has an office onsite for staff, that also provides a space for tenant and staff activities such as therapeutic groups, meetings, and also offers books and art supplies, or just a place to sit and

enjoy the company of others.

All of Jackson Park's units are HUD-eligible. Tenants are responsible for a portion of the rent and all utilities. Both ColumbiaCare and the referring agency screen all tenants for clinical appropriateness.


Staff are onsite 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The support team includes Supported Housing Associates and a Supportive Housing Supervisor (with overlapping schedules) who provide medication monitoring, assistance with Activities of Daily Living, transportation, meal preparation, shopping, budgeting, and other duties as needed and appropriate.

The Supportive Housing Supervisor provides 5 hours per week of supervision,

staff guidance, coordination with referring agencies, and treatment planning.

Flexible, wraparound services help ensure success for our tenants. This program also has a registered nurse that provides periodic, on-site routine health monitoring and supervision of other staff in medication management.

Qualified Mental Health Professional and Psychiatric services may be provided upon specific agreements with referring agencies.



Who is Served? Jackson Park welcomes referrals from Multnomah County for their clients who have a primary diagnosis of mental illness, are stepping down from the higher levels of care, and who are deemed clinically appropriate for more independent living and community involvement. This program provides intensive community-based services for individuals who are still in need of structured support and some professional services, but who are able to be more independent as they continue to work on recovery.
