

# Kellogg Creek

Residential Treatment Facility (PSRB)



Kellogg Creek is a 6-bed, licensed Residential Treatment Facility serving individuals with serious and persistent mental illness, and who may be under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB).

**Kellogg Creek** (est. 2011) is a two-story, non-secure, co-ed facility licensed by AMH. The program serves individuals with a diagnosis of major mental illness and who may be under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board.

The facility is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with an awake staff (on a 2-2-1 staffing schedule) to provide residential daily structure and support services; and on-site adult outpatient mental health treatment services (such as treatment planning, training, individual therapy,

and discharge planning in coordination with partnering agencies).

An experienced psychiatrist and mental health nurse oversee pharmacological treatment at Kellogg Creek. Primary care physicians are available in the outpatient clinic of Providence Hospital, which is within walking distance of the facility. Clackamas County Behavioral Health provides PSRB case management and other monitoring services. The Psychiatric Security Review Board will also monitor the care and progress of the residents.

A collaborative, comfortable and safe treatment environment

allows every resident to become successful in learning necessary coping skills for community integration. The home itself has a beautiful living room with fireplace, large dining room, and full kitchen. The residents enjoy the privacy of their own bedroom and have access to a shared ADA bathroom and community library/activity room with Internet access.

Kellogg Creek has a back patio area and side yard with raised garden and flower beds, which offer beauty as well as the opportunity for therapeutic outdoor activities. The program is within walking distance of public transportation, shopping, and other services.

**Who is Served?** The program serves 6 individuals who have a primary diagnosis of a major mental illness, and who may also be under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB). Whether prospective residents are stepping down from the State Hospital (or another secure treatment environment), or stepping up from a less restrictive treatment environment due to a need for increased supervision, security and support; each person must be deemed appropriate for this level of community-based care according to a stringent screening, referral, and admit process. Those who are residing at the State Hospital will be evaluated by the hospital's psychiatrists and the treatment team; by the Psychiatric Security Review Board; by mental health professionals at the Community Mental Health Program; and by ColumbiaCare Services to ensure that each individual is ready to step-down into a non-locked residential treatment facility and that the placement will be safe for the community.
